Foreign Ministers Meet at Doha Forum

Foreign Minister of Nepal Hon. Mr. Narayan Prakash Saud held a meeting with H. E. Mr. AK Abdul Momen, Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Government of People's Republic of Bangladesh on 10 December 2023 on the sidelines of Doha Forum.

Matters of mutual interests and ways to strengthen bilateral cooperation in areas such as trade, energy, tourism, and connectivity between the two countries were discussed during the meeting.

Visit of Deputy Speaker

Deputy Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Federal Parliament of Nepal, Hon. Ms. Indira Rana Magar visited Bangladesh from 19-23 November 2023.

While in Dhaka, Hon. Deputy Speaker had a meeting with the Deputy Speaker of the National Parliament of Bangladesh H.E. Mr. Md. Shamsul Haque Tuku on 22 November.

During the meeting, they exchanged views on matters of mutual interest and discussed the role of parliamentary exchanges in further strengthening the bilateral ties between Nepal and Bangladesh. They also deliberated on the need to strengthen economic cooperation, enhance connectivity, and promote people-to-people contacts between the two countries.

Visit of the Parliamentary Delegation from Nepal

An eleven-member parliamentary delegation, jointly led by Chairperson of Agriculture, Cooperatives, and Natural Resources Committee Hon. Dr. Arzu Rana Deuba, and Chairperson of Sustainable Development and Good Governance Committee of the Federal Parliament of Nepal Hon. Mr. Prakash Pantha visited Bangladesh from 2 to 7 October 2023.

The visiting delegation included members of Agriculture, Cooperatives, and Natural Resources Committee –Hon. Ms. Anisha Nepali, Hon. Ms. Binita Kathayat, Hon. Mr. Surya Kumari Shrestha, and Hon. Ms. Rupa Shasi Chaudhary, and members of Sustainable Development and Good Governance Committee –Hon. Ms. Sharada Devi Bhatta and Hon. Mr. Singa Bahadur Biswakarma.

On 3 October, the delegation called on the Speaker of the National Parliament of Bangladesh H.E. Dr. Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury.

During the meeting, they expressed satisfaction over the growing parliamentary exchanges between Nepal and Bangladesh and exchanged views on the role of parliamentarians in further consolidating the bilateral ties between the two countries.

Victory Day Reception

President Mr. Ram Chandra Paudel. He also exchanged greetings with Prime Minister H.E. Sheikh Hasina, Foreign Minister H.E. Dr. A.K. Abdul Momen and other high-level dignitaries present at the event.

Speaker of Parliament Dr. Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury and Chief Justice Obaidul Hassan, cabinet members, Dhaka-based ambassadors, high commissioners and heads of mission, Supreme Court judges, members of parliament, senior political leaders, academics, and business community leaders, among others, attended the reception.

Meeting with Power Secretary

Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari held a meeting with Md. Habibur Rahman, Senior Secretary of Power Division at the Ministry of Power, Energy and Mineral Resources of Bangladesh on 2 November.

They reviewed the progress made in the field of bilateral energy cooperation and agreed to expedite the process to realize power trade between Nepal and Bangladesh at the earliest.

Fourteenth South Asia Economic Summit

The Fourteenth South Asia Economic Summit (SAES XIV) was held in Dhaka on 4-5 November 2023 with the overarching theme "Reframing South Asian Regional Cooperation in the New Context National and Global Dimensions."

Shahriar Alam highlighted the potential of the ‘golden fiber’ jute in advancing a global green growth strategy. He called upon international partners to collaborate with Bangladesh in promoting jute as a nature-positive, eco-friendly, and sustainable material. The seminar

was followed by a fashion show which showcased an array of clothing and accessories portraying the versatility of the jute products.

Global SDG Youth Summit 2023

The Global SDG Youth Summit 2023, organized by The Earth and Climate Parliament Bangladesh, was held in Dhaka on 17-18 November 2023. Second Secretary Ms. Yojana Bamjan participated in the closing ceremony of the Global SDG Youth Summit 2023 as a special guest.

The Summit, held under the theme of 'Driving Youth Action: Building a Sustainable Future for All', served as a platform to discuss issues on youth participation and engagement in the SDG implementation process.
