Foreign Minister's Visit to Bangladesh

Minister for Foreign Affairs Hon. Mr. Narayan Praskash Saud visited Bangladesh from 12-14 May 2023 to attend the 6th Indian Ocean Conference held in Dhaka on 12-13 May. While in Dhaka, the Foreign Minister addressed the Conference on 13 May. He underscored the strategic, economic, and ecological significance of the Indian Ocean and highlighted its importance as a gateway to international markets for landlocked countries like Nepal.

As he underlined the natural link between mountains and the oceans, he also stressed the urgent need to address the impact of climate change on mountains, oceans, as well as the lives and livelihoods both in the coastal and hinterland states. He called upon the countries to work together to ensure real, robust, and responsible actions for a healthy Indian Ocean and for a peaceful, prosperous, and resilient future of the region.

On 14 May, the Foreign Minister called on the Prime Minister of Bangladesh H.E Sheikh Hasina. During the meeting, various aspects of Nepal-Bangladesh relations were reviewed, and the leaders agreed to work together to enhance cooperation in areas of trade, transit, investment, energy, education, and people-to-people exchanges, among others.





Foreign Minister had a virtual meeting with Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, Minister for Foreign Affairs of Bangladesh on 12 May. On the same day he also attended the inaugural session of the 6th Indian Ocean Conference followed by Cultural Soirée and Dinner hosted by the Prime Minister of Bangladesh H.E. Sheikh Hasina in honour of the visiting heads of delegations. President of Mauritius, Vice President of the Maldives and visiting ministers were among the attendees in the inaugural session.

On the sidelines of the Conference, the Foreign Minister had separate meetings Dr. S. Jaishankar, Minister for External Affairs of India, Mr. Takagi Kei, Parliamentary Vice Minister for Foreign Affairs of Japan, Dr. Mohamed Maliki bin Osman, Minister in the Prime Minister's Office and Second Minister for Foreign Affairs and Second Minister for Education of Singapore, and Ms. Afreen Akhter, Deputy Assistant Secretary of the United States.

between the two countries. He stressed the role of enhanced connectivity in realizing energy trade and urged the private sector to seize the opportunities available in the hydropower sector.

Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari highlighted the significance of strengthening energy cooperation for the economic advancement and sustainable development of both countries.

Addressing the event, Hon. Foreign Minister underscored Nepal's immense hydropower potential

growing energy needs and emphasized how energy cooperation could be a 'win-win partnership'

Special Guest H.E. Mr. Salman Fazlur Rahman, MP, Advisor to the Prime Minister on Private Industry and Investment underscored the opportunities in power sector cooperation, and stated how partnership between Nepal and Bangladesh could meet the latter's increasing energy demands and promote green and sustainable development.

Energy Secretary Mr. Dinesh Kumar Ghimire reiterated Nepal's commitment to enhancing energy linkages with Bangladesh and emphasized the Government's willingness to materialize power trade in near future. Power Secretary of Bangladesh Mr. Md. Habibur Rahman, BPAA, expressed the readiness of the Government of Bangladesh to explore avenues for joint ventures and knowledge sharing in the field of energy.

Upon completion of his three-day visit to Bangladesh, the Foreign Minister departed for Kathmandu on 14 May.

During the visit, he was accompanied by his spouse Ms. Jyotshna Adhikari Saud, Joint Secretary at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Mr. Ram Prasad Subedi, and Personal Secretary to the Foreign Minister Mr. Khuman Thapa Chhetri.

Embassy's Event on Realizing Energy Cooperation

On the occasion of the Minister for Foreign Affairs Hon. Mr. Narayan Prakash Saud's visit to Bangladesh, the Embassy organized an event on 'Realizing Energy Cooperation between Nepal and Bangladesh' on 13 May. The event was organized with a view to promoting dialogue among key stakeholders and fostering collaboration in the energy sector between the two countries.

Independent Power Producers' Association, Nepal (IPPAN) made a presentation on energy collaboration between Nepal and Bangladesh. They expressed their desire to work closely with relevant stakeholders of Bangladesh to facilitate investment in Nepal's hydropower sector.

The programme was attended by about 100 participants including the members of parliament, high-ranking government officials, business leaders, major energy entrepreneurs from both Nepal and Bangladesh, Dhaka-based Nepali professionals, and media persons, among others.

Signing of the 'Lease Deed'

The long pending 'Lease Deed' between the Embassy and Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (RAJUK) of Bangladesh was concluded on 20 June 2023. Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari and RAJUK chairman Mr. Md. Anisur Rahman Miya signed the agreement on the allotment of the land for the Embassy on lease for the next 99 years, amidst the special ceremony held at RAJUK.

The Embassy had purchased 72,000 square feet of land in Baridhara Diplomatic Zone in 1978. The new 'Lease Deed' was concluded as per the requirements of the Rajdhani Unnayan Kartipakkha (RAJUK) of the Government of Bangladesh. The Government of Nepal had also made a decision towards this end on 19 Baisakh 2080, i.e. 2 May 2023.

Fifth Meeting of Energy Secretary-Level Meeting

Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari participated in the fifth meeting of Nepal-Bangladesh Energy Secretary-level meeting held in Patuakhali, Bangladesh on 17 May 2023. While the Nepali delegation was led by Secretary (Energy) of Ministry of Energy, Water Resources and Irrigation Mr. Dinesh Kumar Ghimire, Bangladeshi side was led by Power Division Secretary Mr. Md Habibur Rahman. The two delegations reviewed the progress on the decisions of the 4th Joint Working Group and Joint Steering Committee meetings held in Kathmandu last year.

During the meeting, the two sides agreed to make efforts to materialize the export of 40-50 MW of electricity from Nepal to Bangladesh through the existing Indian interconnection grid lines.

The meeting also agreed that the broader issues related to power trade and transmission between Nepal and Bangladesh would be finalized through the Bangladesh-India-Nepal tripartite agreement. The meeting deliberated on the possibility of investment from Bangladesh in Nepal's hydropower sector.

The deliberations were focused on the development of the 683 MW Sunkoshi III hydropower project on a joint venture basis. The two sides agreed that Nepal Electricity Authority and Bangladesh Power Development Board would continue to work towards this end.

The two delegations also agreed to facilitate the agreement between GMR Company of India and the Government of Bangladesh for the purchase of 500 MW of electricity from the 900 MW Upper Karnali Hydropower Project in western Nepal. Possible collaborations between the two countries in the renewable energy sector, especially in the field of Solar Home System (SHS) were also discussed during the meeting.

Seventh Meeting of Joint Expert Committee on Water Resources

The Seventh Meeting of Nepal-Bangladesh Joint Expert Committee on Harnessing of Water Resources and Mitigating Floods and Flood Damages was held in Dhaka on 30 May. The Nepali delegation was led by Mr. Gopal Prasad Sigdel, Secretary, Ministry of Energy, Water Resources and Irrigation whereas the Bangladesh side was led by Mr. Nazmul Ahsan, Secretary of the Ministry of Water Resources of Bangladesh. Deputy Chief of Mission Ms. Lalita Silwal participated in the meeting as a member of the Nepali deligation.

During the meeting, the two sides discussed matters of mutual interest including collaboration in the development and management of water resources. The meeting made deliberations on the opportunities for sharing knowledge and experience in irrigation water management.

The two secretaries also signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) between Nepal and Bangladesh on 'Sharing of Real-time Hydrometeorological Data and Information for Flood Forecasting and Warning'. The MoU is expected to facilitate the smooth exchange of hydrometeorological data during monsoon and extreme weather conditions.

Ambassador's Lecture at Cosmos Foundation

Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari delivered a keynote lecture on 'Nepal- Bangladesh Relations: Prognosis for the Future' at the Ambassadors' Lecture Series hosted by Cosmos Foundation on 22 June 2023 in Dhaka.

Delivering his address, the ambassador underscored the organic evolution of Nepal-Bangladesh relations over the last five decades in a spirit of good neighborliness. He also underlined the progressive trends seen in bilateral relations in the areas of energy, trade, transit, and investment. He highlighted the need to enhance collaboration on six key areas of cooperation including trade and investment, crossborder energy transmission, connectivity, cultural

and people-to-people exchanges, climate partnership, and cooperation at multilateral forums.

Former Bangladeshi High Commissioner to India and Ambassador to the United States and Honorary Emeritus Advisor to Cosmos Foundation Mr. Tariq A Karim chaired the discussion while Vice President of Cosmos Foundation Mr. Masud Khan delivered both welcome and closing remarks.

The deliberations of the event covered a wide range of matters pertaining to Nepal-Bangladesh relations, including trade and investment, energy cooperation, connectivity, cultural and educational cooperation, and people-to-people exchanges, among others. The programme was attended by high-level participants including diplomats, experts, officials, and academics.

Meeting with Parliamentary Friendship Group

Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari met with Chairman Mr. Md. Abdus Shahid, MP, and members of Parliamentary Friendship Group on 9 May at the National Parliament of Bangladesh.

They exchanged views on further strengthening bilateral relations including through parliamentary exchanges between the two countries. The Chairman and members of the Friendship Group shared fond memories of their collaboration with Nepal and expressed their willingness to do their part to enhance parliamentary ties between their two countries.

The Ambassador thanked the Chairman and members of the Friendship Group for their goodwill and cooperation towards enhancing Nepal-Bangladesh relations and expressed his commitment to facilitate further parliamentary exchanges between the two countries.

Engagements with Members of Bangladesh's National Parliament

Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari held a meeting with the member of parliament Ms. Waseqa Ayesha Khan on 11 June. She is the Chairperson of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Energy and Vice-Chairperson of Climate Parliament of Bangladesh and has been actively advocating for the

use of clean energy. During the meeting, they discussed the need to enhance collaboration between Nepal and Bangladesh in promoting clean energy sources, such as hydropower and solar energy. MP Ms. Khan underscored the importance of renewable energy to mitigate the effects of climate change and to ensure sustainable development in both countries.

They also deliberated on the importance of sharing knowledge and best practices to foster green growth, especially when both Nepal and Bangladesh are poised to graduate from the LDC category in 2026.

Similarly, the Ambassador had a meeting with Mr. Nahim Razzaq, MP, on 30 April at the Embassy. The discussion focused on the ways to enhance Nepal-Bangladesh relations, particularly in the areas of trade, investment, energy cooperation, tourism, and parliamentary exchanges.

They also exchanged views on how exchanges between the parliaments of the two countries could be utilized to enhance collaboration in the areas such as trade, energy, climate change, LDC graduation, and tourism, among others.

Tourism Networking Reception and B2B Exchange Programme

The Embassy, Nepal Tourism Board and Hotel Association Nepal jointly organized a 'Tourism Networking Reception and B2B Exchange Programme' in Dhaka on 21 June 2023. The main objective of the event was to build networks and connections, both at G2G and B2B levels in order to promote tourism exchanges between Nepal and Bangladesh.

Speaking on the occasion, Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari highlighted the important role played by tourism and hospitality entrepreneurs in building stronger bonds between Nepal and Bangladesh. He also underscored the need for collaboration and partnership to promote tourism and consolidate connections between the peoples, cultures, and societies of the two countries.

The Programme was attended by over 140 participants, including officials from Government of Bangladesh, representatives of travel agencies, tour operators, hotels and airlines, and other hospitality, travel, and tourism-related organizations of Bangladesh.

An MoU between Hotel Association Nepal and Bangladesh International Hotel Association was signed for collaboration in the hospitality sector.

The visiting delegation from Nepal comprised 30 members including officials from Nepal Tourism Board, Hotel Association Nepal, and representatives of 16 different hotels. They interacted with their counterparts from Bangladesh and shared information regarding the services their organizations had to offer to travelers and tourists.

Mujib's Bangladesh Tourism Promotion and B2B Exchange

A nine-member Nepali delegation consisting of officials of Nepal Tourism Board (NTB) and entrepreneurs representing from tourism and hospitality organizations from Nepal visited Dhaka to participate in the Mujib's Bangladesh Tourism Promotion and B2B Exchange organized by Bangladesh Tourism Board in collaboration with the Ministry of Culture and Tourism of Bangladesh on 26-29 May 2023.

Speaking as a special guest during the closing ceremony of the event on 27 May, Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari underlined the crucial role of tourism entrepreneurs of the participating countries in promoting tourism linkages among countries in the region and building stronger bonds between the peoples and societies of these countries.

The programme was attended by representatives from South Asian countries - Nepal, Bangladesh, India, Bhutan, and Sri Lanka and included B2B and networking sessions.

Nepal Netra Jyoti Sangh Delegation's Visit to Bangladesh

A Nepali delegation consisting of the representatives of the Ministry of Health and Population and Nepal Netra Jyoti Sangh (NNJS) visited Bangladesh from 3 to 8 April.

The delegation had meetings with the Health Secretary and officials of the Ministry of Health and Welfare of Bangladesh on 4 April 2023. During the meeting, the two sides exchanged views on possible cooperation between Nepal and Bangladesh in the sector of eye care services.

The Embassy also coordinated the delegation's meetings with the Country Representative of Turkish Cooperation and Coordination Agency (TIKA) in Dhaka, the Project Coordinator of BRAC Urban Health, and the representatives of Viva Care Pvt. Ltd, with the objectives of exploring partnerships and collaboration in the field of eye care. On 6 April, the delegation held an interaction session with the Mayor of Lalmonirhat district in the northern part of Bangladesh.




During the meeting, views were exchanged on possible extension of BRAC programmes in Nepal in the areas including community empowerment, sustainable agriculture, and skills for youth.
